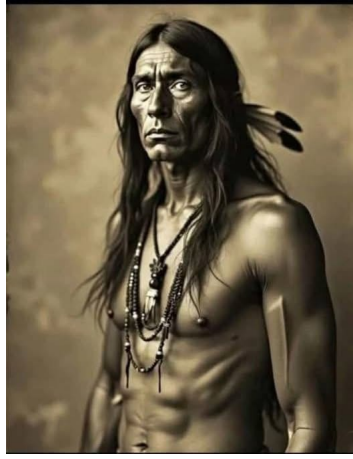

When Crazy Horse was stabbed at Fort Robinson in 1877, his cousin Touch the Cloud stood by his side. Refusing to let the great Lakota warrior die abandoned on the ground, he and a few others took him to the aide's office — so that his last breath would come between his people, not his captors.

But what followed remains one of the most silent yet powerful acts of the Lakota Resistance. That same night, under the watch of soldiers, Touch the Cloud lifted the body of

Crazy Horse, carefully wrapped in a buffalo robe. The elders had prepared a decoy - the body of a deer, disguised to resemble the fallen chief, left behind to deceive the guards.

The soldiers believed they were still holding the warrior. In fact, Crazy Horse had already been taken home, taken into the arms of his people. His death became not only an end, but a final act of defiance. Through this deception, the Lakota gained one last victory: the right to mourn Crazy Horse in their own way, away from the eyes of an army that tried to silence him. And through story and song, the memory of that holy night lives on - the warrior who could not be locked up, not even dead.

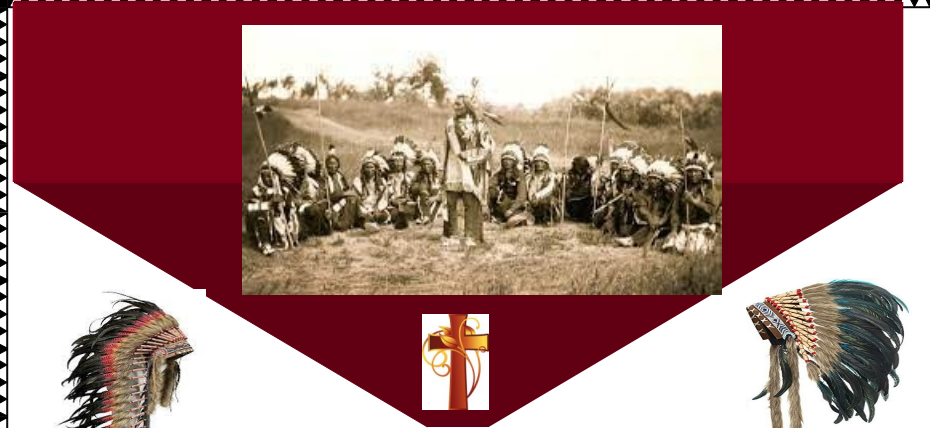

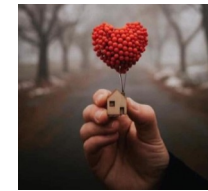

**Spiritual Services
2026 Spiritual Care Volunteer
Certificate Training Course**

Spiritual Services at Froedtert & Medical College of Wisconsin will conduct a training course for spiritual care volunteers. This course is designed for persons interested in developing spiritual care skills in preparation for hospital or parish visitation. Members of all faith traditions are invited to participate. The course is free of charge and is offered as a service to the greater Milwaukee faith community.

The training sessions will cover the following topics:

- Listening and responding appropriately to patients
- Awareness and acceptance of feelings
- Dealing with illness, loss, and grief
- Role-playing to develop visiting skills
- Developing empathy with appropriate boundaries
- Prayer in spiritual care
- Visiting patients and receiving feedback on the quality of those visits
- Observing health and safety precautions, privacy, confidentiality
- Self-care in care giving
- Cultural diversity in spiritual care

Those who successfully complete the training course will gain spiritual care skills to use in parish/congregation or hospital settings and will be awarded a Spiritual Care Volunteer Certificate.

If participants are interested, this training may make them eligible to become Spiritual Care Volunteers at Froedtert Hospital.

Applicants must be people of generosity and compassion. They must believe that spirituality is a necessary part of patient care. They must be recommended in writing by their religious leader, spiritual director or provide a character reference.
