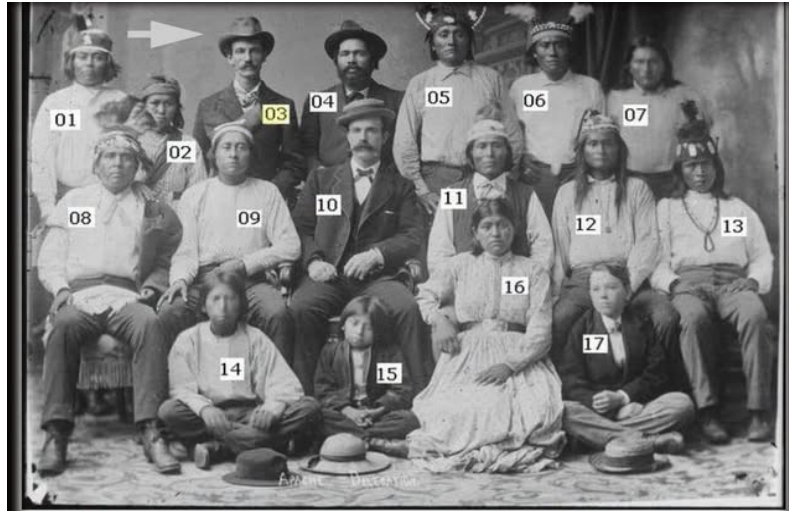

Apache Delegation with John Clum 1876 - Washington

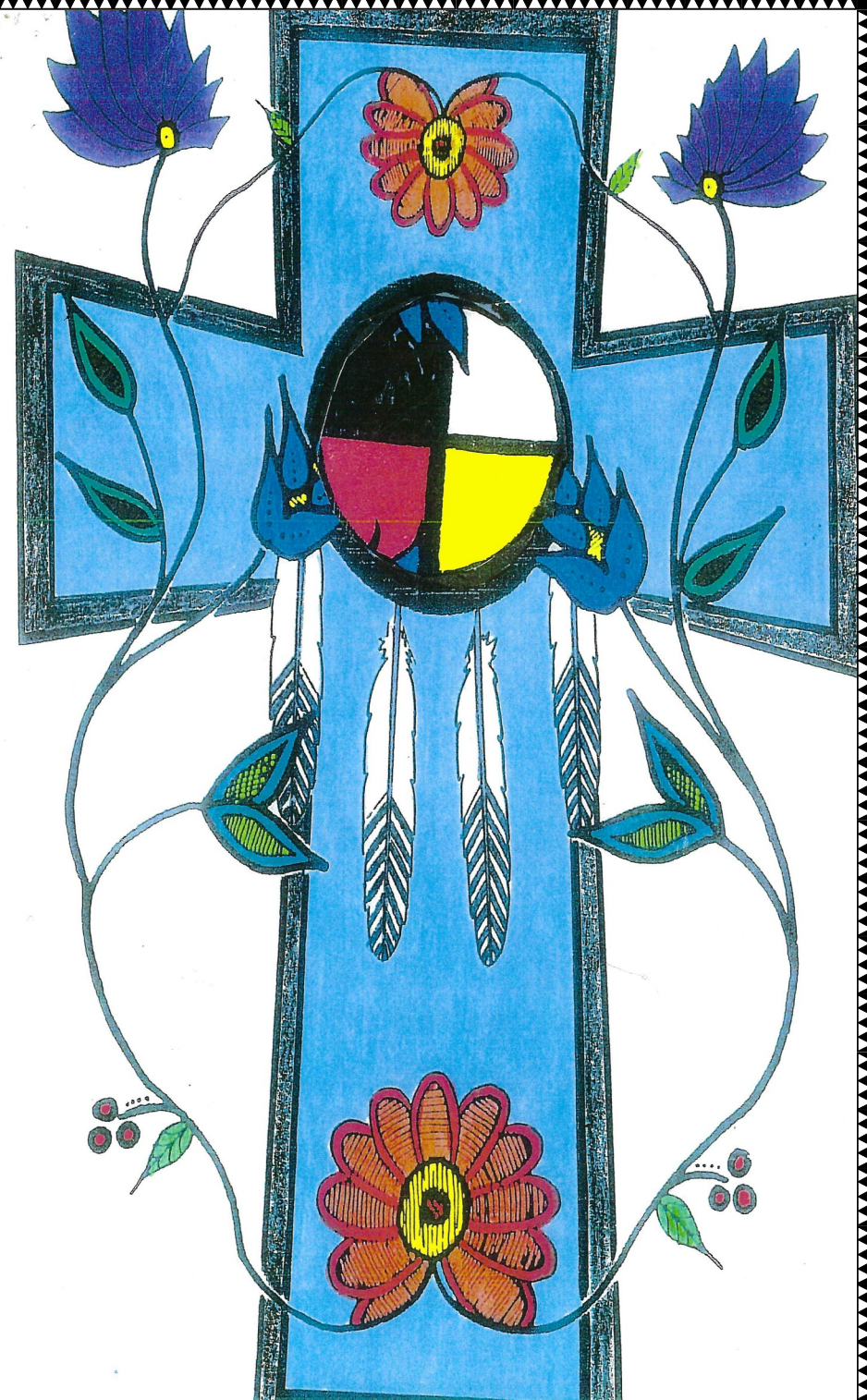

This rare photograph captures more than just faces—it preserves a moment when diplomacy, negotiation, and cultural exchange briefly took center stage amid years of conflict in the American Southwest.

In 1876, a delegation of Apache leaders traveled to Washington, D.C., with Indian agent John P. Clum to meet federal officials during a pivotal period in Arizona Territory's history. The group included well-known Apache leaders such as Eskiminzin and Diablo, along with interpreters and others connected to the delegation. Standing third from the left is Archie McIntosh, a trusted Army scout and interpreter who played an important role in bridging communication between the Apache and U.S. officials....

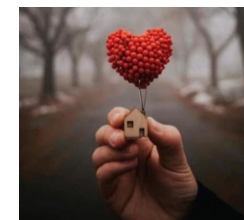
